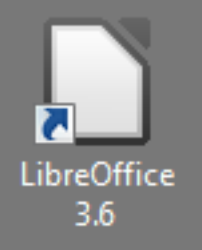


## How to Report Startup Programs.

In the search box, type notepad and tap the enter key.

type info.txt >> Startup-info.txt

notepad Startup-info.txt

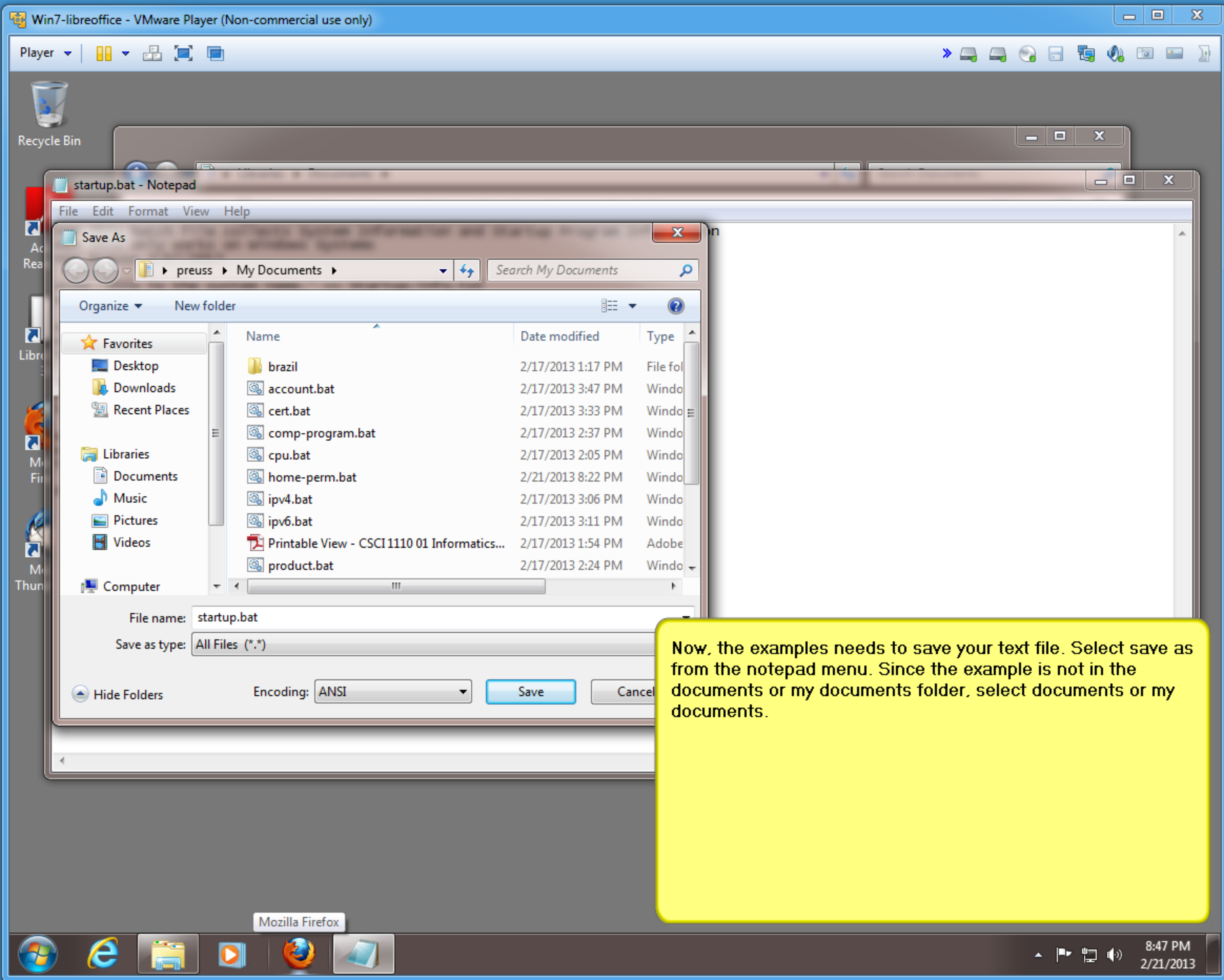

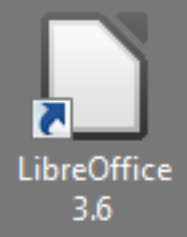

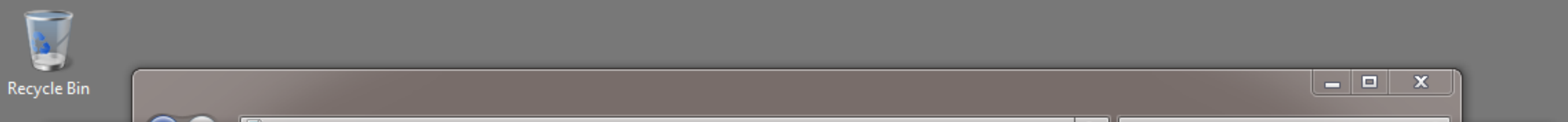
